

Forord

Hensigten med det foreliggende arbejde har været at udrede de store europæiske fyrstedyndastiers hovedlinjer, såvel som forbindelserne imellem dem. Til forskel fra andre stamtavler kan det her anvendte system medtage anonyme personer, der er nødvendige for sammenhængen, når man kan slutte sig til deres eksistens. (For eksempel har ethvert menneske haft en mor, hvad enten vi kender hendes navn eller ej). Den anvendte metode vil hurtigt forstås af enhver, og personer med specialviden om enkelte fyrsteslægter vil let kunne finde tilknytningspunkter til deres eget stof i tavlerne. Ikke enhver tilgængelig sidelinje er blevet udredet og anbragt, men det håbes, at de fleste suveræner af betydning er blevet korrekt placeret i deres omgivelser. Bogen kunne måske endog blive en udfordring for en og anden til at gå på jagt efter navne – og øvrigt slægtskab – på anonyme personer, som forfatterne ikke har været i stand til at finde.

Forfatterne, *Robert William Harvest* og *Helga Tulinius*, har udarbejdet tavlerne fra mange kilder; næsten alt, hvad der kunne findes trykt: annaler, historiske værker, statskalendere, biografiske håndbøger, leksika, ofte ældre bøger, fordi de nyere gerne udelader eller forkorter meget, der tidligere var med. Arkivstudier har ikke været forsøgt. Når oplysninger fra fjernt adskilte kilder har vist overensstemmelse, har dette været taget som bevis for deres rigtighed.

Bogen har sit tyngdepunkt i fortiden. Nutiden lægger hver dag noget til dens emne, så her vil den altid værebagefter. Stavemåde og sprog har voldt stort besvær. Sluttelig blev det vedtaget så vidt muligt at bruge hvert enkelt lands sprog. Det måtte synes tydeligere at bevare de nationale former, *John, Jean, Juan, Jon, Ian, Ivan, João, Giovanni, Johannes, Hans*, end at følge den tyske vane at kalde dem alle *Johann*; f.eks. *Guillaume* leder straks tanken hen på Frankrig, og *Lodovico* på Italien, og det samme gør sig gældende med titler. Læsere med speciel interesse for et enkelt land vil som oftest have et vist kendskab til dets sprog. Tiden har også mange virkninger på stavemåder; en gennemført ortografi har ikke været mulig. Den berømte kejser *Karl den Store* har været kaldt *Charlemagne, Carolus Magnus, Karl der Grosse, Charles Premier le Grand, Carlomagno, Carlos I, Carlos el Grande*, i de lande, han regerede over. Selv underskrev han sig *Karolus*. Det er klart, at man må træffe et valg.

Tidsmæssigt dækker hver planche ca. 300 år med visse undtagelser, der skyldes pladshensyn. Det har været ugørligt at opnå en strengt konsekvent rækkefølge af siderne, men dette skulle ikke volde læserne nogen særlig vanskelighed.

At gøre en slægts stamtavle komplet er en umulighed; at prøve på det ville gøre bogen både omfangsrig og ubrugelig i praksis. Småfejl vil kunne findes, men selve systemet gør dem ofte lette at opdage.

Bogen som sådan er beskyttet af forfatterretten, men dens metode er det ikke, og det ville ikke genere opfindereren deraf, hvis andre i fremtiden skulle finde på at anvende den.

Forfatterne er kun amatør-genealoger, men da denne omfattende oversigt er den eneste let tilgængelige om emnet, har vi ment, at den fortjente ofentliggørelse, og vi håber, at læseren vil dele dette synspunkt efter flittig brug af bogen.

Preface

The aim of the work presented here has been to elucidate the main lineages of the great dynasties of Europe, and the interrelations between them. In contrast to other genealogical tables the system used makes it possible to include anonymous persons necessary for continuity, whose existence can be inferred. (Any person has a mother, whether we know her name or not, for instance). The system is understood at a glance, and anyone with knowledge in a special field can easily find the point in the tables to hinge pedigrees known to him on to. Not every accessible branch of all the families has been explored and inserted, but it is hoped that most of the sovereigns of importance have been correctly placed in their surroundings. The book might even be a challenge for someone to hunt for names and further relations of these anonymous persons that the authors have not been able to find.

The authors, *Robert William Harvest* and *Helga Tulinius*, have plotted the tables out from many sources; virtually everything that was to be found on public record: annals, chronicles, calendars, biographical handbooks, encyclopedias, often older works, since modern handbooks tend to exclude or unduly abbreviate much that was thought necessary formerly. Archive studies have not been attempted. When reports from widely separate sources have yielded congruent information this was taken as proof of its validity.

The essence of the book is in the past. The recent part of it will always lag behind, since every new day is adding to it. Spelling and language has caused much vacillation. It was finally thought best to use the special language of each country as far as possible. The endless rows in German books of *Johann* for *John*, *Jean*, *Juan*, *Jon*, *Ian*, *Ivan*, *João*, *Giovanni*, *Johannes*, *Hans*, are perhaps rational but hardly clarifying, whereas *Guillaume* at once points to France and *Lodovico* to Italy. So it was decided to use the national forms of names and titles. The reader specially interested in a country will usually know sufficient about its linguistic peculiarities anyway. Time also does funny things to spelling, so that an orthography in this book has hardly been possible. The illustrious emperor *Charles the Great* has been called not only that but *Charlemagne*, *Carolus Magnus*, *Karl den Store*, *Karl der Grosse*, *Charles Premier le Grand*, *Carlomagno*, *Carlos I*, *Carlos el Grande*, in the countries he ruled. He signed himself *Karolus*. We can't insert them all.

Chronologically, each page usually covers 300 years, but there are a few exceptions to this for spatial reasons. It has not been possible to maintain a rational sequence of pages, but that should not give much difficulty.

To try for completeness in a work like this would be to ask the impossible; to attempt it would make the book unwieldy and practically useless. Minor faults may be detected but the system itself favours such detection.

The book as such is copyrighted, but the system is not and its inventor will not feel infringed upon, if it should be adopted by others.

The authors are only amateur genealogists, but in view of the fact that this elaborate survey is the only available synopsis of its subject, the publishers have thought that it deserved publication, and they hope that the reader will share this view after perusal of the book.
