

# Members of the Sundsted family settling in Dagmar:

In 1907 **Erik** (b.1880) and **Anton** (b.1882), homesteaded nine miles northwest of Dagmar.

Their sisters: **Elsine Katrine**(b.1887) homesteaded in 1908 and **Marie Magdalene** (b.1886) took her
homestead in 1910. Brother **Thomas**(b.1889) and their father, **B-2. Knud Sundsted** (b.1840) also arrived that
year together with his wife, Marie.

Grandpa Knud said when he came to Dagmar in 1910: "This is good soil."

Grandpa Knud died in 1911 and was buried in the Nathanael Lutheran Cemetery of Dagmar.

### ELSINE KATRINE SUNDSTED'S HOMESTEAD SOD SHACK - 1907

Elsine Katrine, the "mother" of the family, ran the household on the Sundsted Company farm for many years before she married Jim Kaae in 1926.



In the spring of 1908, **E-2, C.C. Christen "Chris" Sundsted**, the father of "Maggie" and her husband, **Chris Johansen** (1882-1944) decided to take advantage of the Homestead Act.

They filed on pieces of adjoining land some seven miles southeast of Antelope. A small frame house was built on C.C. Sundsted's land. They began to erect a sod shack and then went back to their families in Racine WI. for the winter.

In the spring of 1909, both families came out to settle permanently on the Montana prairie.

"Maggie" and her husband, with their two little girls, Elsine (b.1907) and Agnes (b. 1908) lived with Grandpa Sundsted's in his frame house, until their own two room, two window, sod shack could be completed.

Here their children, Carl was born in 1911; Chris in 1913; a daughter, Helen, who lived only two months in 1917; and a daughter, Helen, in 1918.



In 1907, after reading articles about the Danish settlement Dagmar in the Danish-language newspapers, "Dannevirke" and "Den Danske Pioneer", the family members:

Anton (1882-1964), Erik (1880-1971) and Elsine Katrine (1887-1976) arrived in Montana from Racine Wisconsin.

They homesteaded in Dagmar, which became known as "Racine Valley" because of the many Danish immigrants who came from Racine.

In 1908 C.C. Sundsted, (1854-1921), his wife Ane Marie (1885-1904) and their youngest son Niels (1902-1980) arrived. Their older son, Thomas, (1890-1958) came in 1910, but returned to Racine in 1913.

In 1909, Magdalene "Maggie" (1879-1949) her husband, "Chris"
Johansen, (1882-1949). Also, her cousin, Marie Magdalene (1886-1971) married 1912 to Mikkel
Poulsen (1886-1963) also arrived and homesteaded in Racine Valley.

### E-5. C.C. Sundsted's home under construction – 1907

During the summer of 1908, C.C. Sundsted constructed a house consisting of three rooms, a kitchen and clothes room. It was the only house in the neighborhood constructed of wood which had to be hauled by wagon from Culbertson.





### MOGUL GAS FARM TRACTOR BREAKING SOD

Erik Sundsted broke 400 acres with a walking plow. Later with Moguls, Titans and Fordson tractors they ended up wit 1900 acres broke to farm. Erik said the Moguls were a junk pile, the Titans were worse, but the Fordsons were heaven.





### SUNDSTED COMPANY - Breaking sod with a Fordson Tractor

The Fordson Model F had a 4-cylinder gasoline engine, a 3-speed transmission, and a worm gear final drive. It had four wheels and looked a little like a modern tractor with the exception that the wheel were all steel with no rubber tires and instead sported metal spikes for traction in soil.

# SUNDSTED COMPANY THRESRING RIG -POWERED BY AN INTERNATIONAL HARVESTER (IH)

In 1912 the Sundsted Farm Company bought their own threshing rig, a Case 36" separator powered by their Mogul. At that time, they had several separators and threshed until 1926 when they bought a 16' Case combine. One fall they cut over 2200 acres between their own and custom combining.

When the five brothers and sisters homesteaded in Montana and built their company house, the they divided the work between them in the most practical way – each according to ability and preferences:

Erik became the foreman, Anton was the mechanic, Thomas the bookkeeper, and the two sisters Marie and Katrine became cooks and housekeepers.

### JUNE 5th CELEBRATION - SUNDSTED COMPANY HOUSE

**Constitution Day** (Danish: *Grundlovsdag*) is observed in Demark on 5 June.

The day honors the first Constitution of Denmark 1849.

On that day in 1915 Danish women won the right to vote.

Grundlovsdag is widely celebrated throughout Denmark with church congregations, associations and political organizations meeting for what are essentially "secular services". These services include the raising of Dannebrog, the Danish flag, a short speech by a local politician or celebrity, and collective singing (Danish: fællessang).

### NATHANAEL LUTHERAN CHURCH - DAGMAR MONTANA



Nathanael Danish Evangelical Lutheran Church was organized June 9, 1907, less than a year after the first Danish settlers came to the area and established the colony of Dagmar, Montana.

In the summer of 1910, a small meeting house was completed at a cost of \$1200, and it was used for social gatherings as well as worship. The cornerstone was laid during the **midsummerfest** in 1915, and the church was dedicated December 17, 1916.




### INTERIOR - NATHANAEL LUTHERAN CHURCH - DAGMAR

Even today Nathanael is still a totally rural church with the parsonage across the yard from the church.

The congregation bought ten acres for a building site. A cemetery was dedicated across the corner from the church property on August 21, 1909, and that same day one of the first to take land in the colony was buried there.

A copy of the statue (original 1821) by the Danish sculptor Bertel Thorvaldsen is considered the most perfect statue of Christ in the world. It exists in many copies, both in churches in Denmark and in other churches around the world.

Christ is represented with open arms, saying to the world 'come to me and I will give you rest'.





Marie came to Dagmar in 1909. In1912, she married Mikkel Poulsen, (f. 3 June 1886, Nøderup, Rinkøbing, Denmark – d. 15 August 1963, Plentywood, Sheridan, Montana). He emigrated in October 1906.

Due to a clause in the Homestead Act, they were unable to keep both their homesteads when they married. They decided to keep Marie's, which at that time was just a sod shack.

Both were born in Denmark.

Three children were born to them on this homestead.

Knud Christian was born in the sod shack, their first home. His sisters, Karen Christiana and Ann Viola were born in a little two room house the parents had built on their land.

In 1918 they sold their homestead to the Sundsted brothers and bought a farm five miles northeast of their old homestead where there was more room for expansion.

The couple, both born in Denmark, arrived in Dagmar, Racine Valley, in 1909. They had 6 Children.



Erik Sundsted, built two living monuments to himself in the Dagmar community. These were in the form of attractive groves of trees on the farmsteads now occupied by Erik, Jr. and by Carl Sundsted.

In the earlier Dagmar years his first grove of trees was one of the finest in the area and was the site of large Fourth of July celebrations when people would assemble in the trees for picnic lunches, speeches and lusty singing. Then would follow baseball games, horseshoe playing and all forms of races with case prizes for the winners.
